

PE Sports funding - Report to Governors - Autumn 2020

This year we have introduced the use of the Amaven assessment programme to ensure each class accesses lessons tailored to improve the core physical literacy within P.E. and to provide the opportunity for children to access structured Amaven sessions at home via the Homework function. As our academic year was cut short because of Covid19, we were only able to have one assessment day and were unable to track the progress of the children.

An ongoing focus has been on ensuring that as many children as possible are able to access P.E. outside of school through clubs and competitive sport. There has been a significant uptake as a result of our focus on this with children taking part in activities outside of the school day across KS2 and KS1. By March 2020, 38% of KS1 children and 57% of KS2 children had partaken in an afterschool club, however many Summer clubs and competitions were unable to take place due to Covid19.

Moving forward, our school will continue to develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport activities that we already offer and build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years and will ensure sustainability.
