

PE Sports funding – Report to Governors – Summer 2024



We continued to use the Amaven platform to deliver PE lessons this year but have decided to move away from this for next year as we felt the assessment was too narrow to give a true reflection. During Summer term we started to trial Get Set 4 PE reading to use from Sept 2024. We feel that this will give us better coverage and ensure progression of skills for every year group in all units.

PE learning walks showed strengths in PE delivery, including all children active and engaged. Positive pupil voice completed. Children enjoy PE and understand the importance of PE in the curriculum.

Whole school assembly to ensure all children and staff understand the importance of activity levels in school and out of school. Children expected to be active for 60mins a day which includes 30mins a day in school.

New playground markings encourage children to be active at playtimes.

Whitby Heath achieved the Silver School games Mark this year. PE lessons were restricted to 1 hour a week but will move to 2 hours a week from September 2024 as recommended.

We offered a wide range of after school clubs this year, including a range of sports and physical activities for children of all abilities. Multi Skills, cricket, Football and Fencing in KS1. Football, Girl's Football, Netball, Dance, Cross Country, Cricket, Archery, Ultimate Frisbee, Tag Rugby and Fencing in KS2. We offered a Dodgeball Club to PP children.

Inter school competitions –Tag Rugby, football, girl's football, cross country, basketball, dance, Athletics, cricket, orienteering, tri golf, swimming gala

Success in Year 5 Mini kickers, reaching the finals day. – Year 4 reached the final, cross country top 3 finishes .OC, AS. Girl's cricket team reached the finals day.

SEND competitions attended including Ten pin bowling, Boccia and NAK.

Cheshire Cricket Board worked with Y3 and Y6. After School Club offered to Year 2 and 3.

S4YC – Dance CPD sessions with Year 1 and Year 2 and Year 5.

Sports Crew continued to help develop sports and physical activity across the school. We hope to develop this further and encourage all children to be more active.
